As a former sixteen year Superintendent of Schools, I am pleased to recommend Ms. Jessica Bilello for a position in Secondary English in your school district.

I have known Jessica for five years. She has been a student in several of my classes at Albright. When we began our new course EDU 320 Communication Skills for Teachers in Spring 2006, Jessica was the only freshman in three sections of that course.

As a "4+1" student, Jessica took my courses in EDU 510 Statistics and Research, EDU 618 School Culture and Politics, EDU 520 Curriculum Development, and LSS 534 Literary Portraits of the Public School.

With a keen sense of humor as well as understatement, Jessica was able to bring together students with widely different personalities to complete the class work as assigned or simply to get the class through an evening in which a difficult topic needed to be mastered. **Work Ethic:** In my five years at Albright, I have rarely seen a student with Jessica's almost old-fashioned focus on achievement and accomplishment. Frankly, most college students look for the easiest way out with the least amount of work. Jessica was one of the few who always took the most difficult courses and who selected the most difficult assignments within those courses. She approached every class fully prepared. She read and mastered her assigned content, and she came prepared to participate. Her transcript speaks to the quality of work she presented to our faculty.

**Preparation:** With the completion of her two secondary methods courses, her early field experience, and her student teaching, she is well prepared to enter any secondary English assignment. She possesses the content knowledge to teach grammar, composition and literature in grades 7-12. She possesses a variety of instructional strategies in all areas. She certainly possesses outstanding classroom management techniques as well as the interpersonal skills needed for successful communication between students and teachers.
